Welcome to our monthly Market View. We've analysed activity across the MOTORS platform to provide insights into stock, price, days to sell and demand by consumers based on what they are viewing, including: manufacturers, models and the increasing interest in electric and hybrid vehicles. We look at comparison time periods so that you can spot emerging trends on a month-by-month basis.





- Average stock volumes were up +7.0% MoM and +2.3% YoY.
- Car supermarkets (+12.5%) and franchises (+11.9%) saw significant MoM increases in stock volume.
- October saw diesel stock levels fall slightly, down -1.6% while all other fuel types had small increases.

There was -10.2% less diesel stock than this time last year, while alternative fuel vehicles accounted for 17.1% of stock - up from 14.1% in October 2024.




Stock volume by dealer type

Car supermakets had +17.3% more stock than this time last year.

Stock volume for car supermarkets and franchises were at their highest levels since December 2024.



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"October saw dealer used car inventories hit their highest level for the year.

The biggest increase in volume came from younger cars, under two years old, up 2% MoM and 9% YoY.

MOTORS also recorded a more than five-fold MoM increase of 75-plate listings, as pre-registered cars entered the used car market."

- Only vehicles under 2 years old have seen their average price fall both MoM (-1.1%) and YoY (-2.5%).
- Average prices at car supermakets were up +1.4% MoM above the overall average of +1.3%.
- The average price of an EV has fallen by just over £2,400 YoY.




Average price by dealer type

Both car supermarkets and independent dealers saw average prices rise MoM.




Average price by age

Vehicles over 2 years old have seen average prices increase YoY: 2 - 5 yrs (+1.2%), 5 - 10 yrs (+2.7%) and over 10 yrs (+4.7%).



Average price by fuel type

Petrol vehicle prices were up +1.2% MoM, to an average of £16.1k, which is down -2.7% YoY. EVs dropped in price -1.0% MoM.



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The average price of a used car on MOTORS increased in October by 1.3% to £17,877.

The rise was led by car supermarkets which increased by 1.4% MoM to £16,839.



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October 2025 at a glance

- Vauxhall Corsa (8 10 yrs / petrol) saw the largest average price rise MoM, up +5.8%.
- Ford Focus (8 10 yrs / petrol) dropped the most, down -3.8% MoM.
- Across the regions, North East England (+10.6%) and Northern Ireland (+11.3%) have seen the biggest YoY increases in overall average price.





Of our selected makes/models only the Vauxhall Corsa has seen it's average price increase YoY, albeit quite small at +1.2% (+£200).







- Overall, vehicles were selling 1.5 days slower than in September and 2 days slower than in August.
- Only franchises saw days to sell drop MoM.
- MG MG3 (Under 6 mths / under 5k miles / hybrid) was racing off the forecourts, on average in just 8.5 days.



- Medium vehicles had the most listings (41.3%) and most ad views (33.7%).
- 60% of stock was vehicles aged between 3 and 10 years old.
- Petrol vehicles accounted for just over half of all listings and ad views.

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October 2025 at a glance

- EV average prices are above hybrid for the fourth month in a row.
- MINI Hatch (3 4 yrs old / 10 20k miles) saw the biggest average price increase for an EV, up +10.1% MoM to £15,666.
- Kia Sportage (3 4 yrs old / 30 40k miles) saw the biggest average price increase for a hybrid, up +6.9% MoM to £22,837.





- MG MG3 was the fastest selling hybrid, on average in just 11.8 days.





Along with a new app it has become the flagship brand in the MOTORS network. Retailers enjoy the simplicity of a single upload, one point of contact and access to a stock management and response reporting centre, ensuring that it is a time-efficient and a value-packed way to advertise.

Each month MOTORS publishes a Market View analysis of the key used car trends across its platform, detailing average pricing, stocking levels and consumer demand. This data provides valuable insight for dealers across the UK.
